

MEDICATION



All medication must be dispensed from the nurse's office. Self-medication is only allowed for students who require an Epi-Pen or rescue inhaler. These students must have the appropriate release, signed by both Physician and parents/guardian, on file in the nurse's office.

Daily Prescription Medication*

Children requiring medication on a daily basis at school must first obtain a written prescription by a physician. The prescription is to be completed on the "Authorization for Administration of Medication" form which can be obtained from the school nurse.

Short term Prescription or Over-the-Counter Medication*

From time to time, children may require short-term medication at school. This could either be antibiotics, eye drops or over the counter (O.T.C.) medications. Parents/guardians are required to drop off the medications in the nurse's office where they can complete a "Short Term Medication Request" form.

***All medication given at school must come in its original container/packaging. No exceptions.**

Daily Medication	(ex. Adderall, inhalers, Epi-pen, etc...)
Short Term Medication Form	(ex. Antibiotics, eye drops, etc...)
Diabetic Medication Form	(ex. Insulin, glucose monitoring, etc...)

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
