

Ringworm

(Fungus infection of the skin)

Symptoms: Circular area that might itch, found on the scalp, may cause hair loss at site, may appear scaly, usually very visible raised edge. May appear dry.

Incubation: Person to person contact. Contact with infected surfaces.
Progresses slowly.

Prevention of Complications: Must be treated to prevent secondary bacterial infections. Your doctor may prescribe oral or topical anti-fungal drugs.

School Control: May attend school with area covered after identified and treatment has begun. A doctor's note and/or name of medication being used is required before attending school.
